ORDER EXTENDING AMENDED EMERGENCY ORDER PERTAINING TO AD VALOREM AND NON-AD VALOREM ASSESSMENTS **(#17-235-DOR-004)**

On September 4, 2017, Governor Rick Scott issued Executive Order Number 17-235 (EO 17-235) in response to Hurricane Irma and declared a state of emergency for every Florida county.

On September 5, 2017, Governor Scott requested that President Donald J. Trump declare a pre-landfall emergency for the State of Florida in preparation for Hurricane Irma. President Trump approved Governor Scott's request on September 5, 2017, and declared that an emergency exists in the State of Florida due to the emergency conditions resulting from Hurricane Irma.

On September 6, 2017, the Florida Department of Revenue (Department) issued its Emergency Order Implementing Provisions of Executive Order Number 17-235 which waives certain timing compliance requirements and provides for additional notice conditions. On September 8, 2017, the Department issued its Amended Order Implementing Provisions of Executive Order Number 17-235 (Amended Order) to clarify that the provisions applied to ad valorem and non-ad valorem assessments. The Amended Order expires thirty (30) days from the date of execution of EO 17-235, unless otherwise extended by the Department.

Pursuant to the authority provided in Section 4 of EO 17-235, the Department

hereby extends the provisions of the Amended Order for an additional thirty (30) days. The provisions set forth by the Department in the Amended Order shall be extended to November 3, 2017.


