David Cruz Update:

No key bills scheduled to be heard at this time. Keep in mind the calendar for later this week has not been released yet. **Update on key bills that are still in play:**

- [CS/HB 519](#) (J. Grant) and [SB 1776](#) (Lee) – **Bert Harris/Private Property Rights Protection** – **Oppose** – CS/HB 519 has passed all committees of reference and is now available to be considered on the House floor. It could be considered by the full House as early as this week. SB 1776 has one more committee stop in Senate Rules before it can be considered by the full Senate. SB 1776 is NOT on this week's Rules Committee agenda. Senate Rules meets one more time after this week on March 3. It could be on the March 3 agenda.
- [CS/CS/CS/HB 637](#) and [CS/CS/SB 1066](#) – **Impact Fees** – **Oppose** – CS/CS/CS/HB 637 passed in its last committee of reference on Feb. 20. The next stop is the House floor. CS/CS/SB 1066 has one more committee stop, Senate Appropriations Committee. Senate Appropriations Committee meets this Thursday, February 27 but we will not know if CS/CS/SB 1066 will be on the agenda until the meeting notice is sent out later today.
- [CS/CS/HB 203](#) and [CS/SB 410](#) – **Growth Management** – **Oppose** – CS/CS/HB 203 has one more committee stop, the House State Affairs Committee. CS/SB 410 has one more committee stop, the Senate Rules Committee. CS/SB 410 is NOT on this week's Rules Committee agenda. Senate Rules meets one more time after this week on March 3.
- [CS/HB 3](#) and [CS/SB 1336](#) – **Preemption of Local Occupational Licensing** – **Oppose** – CS/HB 3 passed the full House (78-40) on February 20. On February 17, CS/SB 1336 was temporarily postponed during its second committee stop in the Senate Innovation, Industry, and Technology Committee. The bill has stalled as this committee has concluded its meetings for this session.
- [CS/HB 537](#) and [SB 778](#) – **Home-based Businesses** – **Oppose** – CS/HB 537 is moving and has one more committee stop, the House Commerce Committee. The Commerce Committee is scheduled to meet next on Thursday, February 27 and CS/HB 537 is likely to be on the agenda. SB 778 has not yet been heard in any of its committees of reference.

Amber Hughes Update:

- [HB 7069](#) (State Affairs Committee) – **Local Government Reporting** – **Oppose** – HB 7069 will be heard on Tuesday, February 25 at 3:30 p.m. in the House Appropriations Committee. This is the only committee reference for HB 7069.
- [HB 7097](#) (Ways and Means Committee) – **Tax Package** – **Watch** – HB 7097 will be heard on Tuesday, February 25 at 3:30 p.m. in the House Appropriations Committee. This is the only committee reference for HB 7097.
- [CS/HB 969](#) (Drake) – **Broadband Internet Service** – **Support** – CS/HB 969 has passed all of its committees of reference and is on the House Special Order Calendar on Wednesday, February 26.
- [HB 1149](#) (DiCeglie) – **Local Government Fiscal Transparency** – **Oppose** – HB 1149 has passed all of its committees of reference and is on the House Special Order Calendar on Wednesday, February 26.

Jeff Branch Update:

No key bills scheduled to be heard at this time. Keep in mind the calendar for later this week has not been released yet. **Update on key bills that are still in play:**

- [SB 7018](#) (Lee) and [HB 7099](#) (State Affairs Committee) – **Electric Vehicle Charging Station Infrastructure/Essential State Infrastructure** – **Oppose** (now that the shot clock utility language is on both bills) – SB 7018 has one more committee stop, the Senate Appropriations Committee. We will not know until later today if the bill is on February 27 meeting agenda. HB 7099 has one committee reference, the House Commerce Committee. The House Commerce Committee meets on Thursday, February 27 but we will not know the meeting agenda until tomorrow afternoon.
- [CS/CS/CS/HB 1371](#) (Fine) and [CS/SB 1000](#) (Perry) – **Traffic and Pedestrian Safety** – **Oppose** – CS/CS/CS/HB 1371 has passed through all of its committees and is now available to be considered by the Full House. CS/SB 1000 has one more committee stop, the Senate Appropriations Committee.
- [CS/CS/SB 998](#) (Hutson) and [CS/CS/HB 1339](#) (Yarborough) – **Housing** – **Oppose** – CS/CS/SB 998 has one more committee stop, the Senate Appropriations Committee. CS/CS/HB 1339 has one more committee stop, the House Commerce Committee.

Casey Cook Update:

No key bills scheduled to be heard at this time. Keep in mind the calendar for later this week has not been released yet. **Update on Short-Term Rentals Bills:**

- [CS/CS/HB 1011](#) (Fischer) – **Vacation Rentals** – **Oppose** – CS/CS/HB 1011 passed its last committee, the House Commerce Committee, last week. The vote was 14-9. The bill is now eligible to be heard on the House floor as early as this Thursday, February 27.
- The next stop for the Senate companion bill, [CS/SB 1128](#) (Diaz), is the Senate Rules Committee. SB 1128 will not be heard in the Rules Committee this week. The Rules Committee meets next week on Tuesday, March 3. The meeting agenda for March 3 will not be known until late afternoon on Thursday, February 27.
- It's important that we continue to put pressure on legislators to vote no on the bills. In the House, please contact all House members and ask them to vote no on CS/CS/HB 1011. In the Senate, please contact members on the Rules Committee and ask them to vote no on CS/SB 1128. Watch for a legislative alert from the League once we know when the bills will be heard. The alert will include contact information for legislators as well as talking points.

Rebecca O'Hara Update:

- [HB 7101](#) (State Affairs Committee) – **State Advisory Bodies** – **Watch** – HB 7101 will be heard on Tuesday, February 25 at 3:30 p.m. in the House Appropriations Committee. This is the only committee stop for HB 7101.

Environmental water issues still in play:

- [CS/SB 1450](#) (Environment and Natural Resources Committee) and [CS/HB 1091](#) (Fine) – **Environmental Enforcement** – **Watch** – CS/SB 1450 has one more committee stop, Senate Appropriations Committee and CS/HB 1091 also has one more committee stop, House State Affairs Committee.
- [CS/CS/SB 712](#) (Mayfield) and [HB 1343](#) (Payne & Ingoglia) – **Water Quality Improvements** – **Watch** – CS/CS/SB 712 has passed all of its committee references and is now eligible to be considered by the full Senate. HB 1343 has one more committee stop, the House State Affairs Committee.

- [CS/CS/SB 1656](#) (Albritton) and [CS/HB 715](#) (Maggard) – **Reclaimed Water** – **Oppose**– CS/CS/SB 1656 has one more committee stop, the Senate Appropriations Committee. CS/HB 715 also has one more committee stop, the House State Affairs Committee.
