Casey Cook Update:

- **HB 1011** (Fischer) – **Short-Term Rentals** – **Oppose** – HB 1011 will be heard today at 3:00 p.m. in the House Workforce Development & Tourism Subcommittee. This is the first of three committee stops. **LEGISLATIVE ALERT:** Please contact members on [Workforce Development & Tourism Subcommittee](#) before 3:00 p.m. today and urge them to vote NO on HB 1011.

Jeff Branch Update:

- **SB 474** (Albritton) – **Deregulation of Professions and Occupations/Mobile Food Trucks** – **Oppose** – SB 474 will be heard today at 2:30 p.m. in the Senate Innovation, Industry, and Technology Committee. This is the first of three committee stops. If your city requires a special food truck license, please contact Jeff at jbranch@flicities.com.
- **SB 538** (Diaz) – **Emergency Reporting** – **Watch** – SB 538 will be heard today at 4:30 p.m. in the Senate Infrastructure and Security Committee. This is the first of three committee stops.
- **CS/HB 915** (Avila) – **Commercial Service Airports** – **Oppose** – CS/HB 915 is scheduled to be heard on Wednesday, January 22 at 12:30 p.m. in the House Transportation & Tourism Appropriations Subcommittee. This is the second of three committee stops.

David Cruz Update:

- Recap on key bills heard last week:
 - **CS/HB 519** (J. Grant) – The Bert Harris Private Property Rights bill passed last week out of the House Civil Justice Subcommittee. It was a party line vote with all democrats voting no on the bill. The next committee stop for CS/HB 519 is the House Commerce Committee. It is possible the bill could be heard during the January 23 meeting; however, the meeting agenda has not yet been released. Please watch for a legislative alert.
 - **CS/HB 637** (DiCeglie) – This bill relates to impact fees and passed out of its first committee of reference last week. The next committee stop is the House Ways & Means Committee. This committee meets on January 24. The meeting agenda has not yet been released so it is unknown if CS/HB 637 is up again this week.
- **SB 1302** (Flores) **Sovereign Immunity** – **Oppose** – SB 1302 will be heard today at 12:00 p.m. in the Senate Judiciary Committee. This is the first of three committee stops.

Amber Hughes (given by Scott Dudley) Update:

- **HB 1149** (DiCeglie) – **Local Government Fiscal Transparency** – **Oppose** – HB 1149 passed this morning in the House Local, Federal & Veterans Affairs Subcommittee. There are two more committee stops in the House.
- **HB 969** (Drake) – **Broadband Internet Service/Mapping** – **Support** – HB 969 will be heard today at 10:00 a.m. in the House Energy & Utilities Subcommittee. This is the first of three committee stops.
- **SB 1142** (Hooper) – **Offenses Against Firefighters** – **Watch** – SB 1142 is being heard today at 10:00 a.m. in the Senate Criminal Justice Committee. This is the first of three committee stops.

- **SB 1112** (Taddeo) – **Bottled Water Excise Tax** – **Watch** – SB 1112 will be heard today at 10:00 a.m. in the Senate Commerce and Tourism Committee. This is the first of three committee stops.

- [HB 1073](#) (Stevenson) – **Statewide Office of Resiliency** – **Support** – HB 1073 will be heard today at 12:30 p.m. in the House Agriculture & Natural Resources Subcommittee. This is the first of three committee stops.
- [SB 1490](#) (Bradley) – **Public Officers and Employees/Gifts** – **Support** – SB 1490 will be heard today at 4:30 p.m. in the Senate Ethics and Elections Committee. This is the first of three committee stops.
- [CS/SB 712](#) (Mayfield) – **Water Quality Improvements** – **Watch** – CS/SB 712 will be heard on Wednesday, January 22 at 1:30 p.m. in the Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government. This is the second of three committee stops.
